- More repetitions of songs so they can be learned and meditated upon while singing and less repetition of songs because it gets boring singing the same thing over and over.

- The band to play in the middle of the platform where they can be seen, back behind the plants where they won't be a distraction, louder, softer, faster, slower, more often, and not at all."


GREATER CHICAGO FOOD. DEPOSITORY

Hello everyone at St. Philip and best wishes for your 50th anniversary celebration!

Unfortunately, we are not able to come to Illinois to join in the festivities, but are enclosing a donation in honor of your anniversary. We are in good health but not the young family we were back in 1967 when we joined St. Philip.

We moved to Glenview in the summer of 1967. Jim had just come off active duty as a Navy pilot and continued in the reserves, so it was the Glenview Naval Air Station that drew us to Glenview. St. Philip was already built, but new and Lowell Anderson was the first pastor. I don't think we were founding members, so somehow the numbers aren't adding up. Maybe St. Philip was a mission church when we joined. Do you have a written history that you might share?

We moved from Glenview to Rancho Palos Verdes, California in January of 1972 and joined St. Paul's Lutheran church where we are still members.
